Supplanting Overview

Definitions

Supplanting, as it relates to grants, occurs when an agency/grantee replaces county or tribal funds with federal or state funds for the same activity.

Match is a required budget allocation which ensures the grantee is dedicating non-grant resources towards the same activity.

Maintaining the Local Investment is Key to avoid Supplanting

In order to avoid supplanting, the agency/grantee should ensure that the local investment (match) in the activity is not reduced or eliminated due to the availability of grant funds.

For the purposes of TAD, each applicant should build a budget that includes a 25% match, as required by state statute. Existing grantees can change what items are state funded or locally funded (match) as long as the local investment in the program remains the same.
